Principal's Message

Department of Education COVID Restrictions

With updated health advice and changes to state and national restrictions, schools have recommenced the majority of school-based activities, however, some restrictions still apply to NSW schools. Please see the outline below:

- 1. Non-essential adults visiting schools including parents and carers are still not permitted for Term 4 with some exemptions eg wellbeing meetings, canteen and uniform shop volunteers.
- 2. P&C meetings should continue online only. P&C social events or functions including dinners, fundraisers, fetes and barbecues that involve parents and other adults are not permitted in Term 4.
- 3. Staff and students must not come to school if they are unwell. Even with very mild symptoms.
- 4. If a student has been absent due to flu-like illness or develops flu-like symptoms while at school, they are not to return until they have a negative COVID-19 test and are symptom-free. The negative COVID-19 test result must be sighted and received by the school for students before their return to school.
- 5. Schools remain vigilant in personal hygiene practices. We continue to promote and encourage regular washing of hands, exclusion of any staff and students who are unwell, avoiding the sharing of food and personal items and cleaning of any shared items such as musical instruments, learning and sporting equipment between uses.

The tree in K-6O enclosed playground has been removed. Termites were eating the tree and it became very dangerous. The tree was reviewed for any historical and Aboriginal heritage and came back clear. Behind the hall another tree was dying therefore it was trimmed down as the arborist stated it was only a matter of time before it collapsed. It is historical and the plaque is still connected and visible.

I am working with AMU to remove two shipping containers and build permanent storage garages and a carport to shelter our school bus. This process takes time but I am confident we will see some work soon.




Planning
